- (c) Briefly discuss Horace's observations on poetry.
- (d) On what grounds does Stephen Gosson condemn poets and dramatists?
- (e) Discuss Coleridge's theory of imagination.

4. Write an illustrative note on the classical Greek idea of poetry as 'mimesis' with reference to the relevant texts of Plato and Aristotle.

How does Aristotle define tragedy in the sixth chapter of the *Poetics*? How does he compare tragedy with history?

5. Analyze the five sources of the sublime according to Longinus and the relevance of this theory in modern literary criticism.

How does Sir Philip Sidney's An Apologie for Poetrie describe the nature of poetry and answer Puritan objections to imaginative literature?

6. What are the three different types of unity according to Johnson? How does Johnson defend Shakespeare's disregard and violation of the three unities in the *Preface to Shakespeare*?

Or

Discuss Matthew Arnold's definition of poetry as 'criticism of life'. Give your assessment of Arnold's views on 'high seriousness'.
